Topics:

- 1) Quotation marks (punctuation, capitalization, integration)
- 2) Sentences (types-compound, complex; sentence fragments; run-on sentences)
- 3) Semicolon/colon
- 4) Plural vs. Possessive nouns
- 5) Commas (how to use: lists, complex sentence, etc.)
- 6) Modifiers (misplaced, dangling)
- 7) Verbs / subject/verb agreement (different forms/tense consistency)
- 8) Dashes, Hyphens and Parentheses.
